Coach John Hillier says "the success our racing team has had this year, in my opinion, boils down to a few factors. 1) Time on the water, split between volunteering at the sailing school, race team practices, keelboat racing, and IOM sailing. 2) Our club and volunteer commitment to baying fact new boats (sails and

volunteer commitment to having fast new boats/sails and a supportive fun environment for the kids to excel and learn. 3) And, most importantly, smart and dedicated kids who have gone through our sailing program over the past few years. We have set a high standard for our club's Junior Program, that has been noticed by other clubs, and I look forward to seeing it grow from here".
